



PHILMONT SCOUT RANCH – HIGH ADVENTURE

JULY 25, 2011 – AUGUST 6, 2011

1 CREW – 12 PARTICIPANTS

Philmont Scout Ranch is the Boy Scouts of America's oldest national high-adventure base. It covers 137,000 acres - about 214 square miles - of rugged mountain wilderness in the Sangre de Cristo (Blood of Christ) range of the Rocky Mountains in northern New Mexico.

Thirty-four staffed camps and 55 trail camps are operated by the ranch. Philmont has high mountains dominating rough terrain with elevations ranging from 6,500 to 12,441 feet.

Philmont Scout Ranch provides an unforgettable 12-day backpacking adventure in sky-high backpacking country along miles of rugged, rocky trails. Program features combine the best of the Old West - horseback riding, burro packing, gold panning, chuck wagon dinners, and interpretive history - with exciting challenges for today, such as rock climbing, burro racing, mountain biking, and .30-06 rifle shooting. It's an unbeatable recipe for fast-moving fun and the outdoors.

YOUTH: To participate in the 2011 Philmont High Adventures you must be a registered Boy Scout, Varsity Scout, Venturer, or Explorer, and at least 14 years of age by January 1, 2011 or completing the eighth grade in the spring of 2011. Complete this application for the 2011 contingent or contact the Council Service Center for more information. Applications and deposit fees must be received at the same time.

LEADERSHIP: The council will select qualified adult leadership for the contingent. Each contingent will consist of ten Scouts and two leaders. Qualified leaders are always welcome and needed. Complete this application for the 2011 contingent or contact the Council Service Center for more information. Applications and deposit fees must be received at the same time.

FEE: The final cost for Philmont 2011 has not been set, but at this time is estimated at \$1,800. Airline and land package prices have not been determined. The cost includes all of the touring plus pre-Philmont training, housing, meals, insurance, airfare, and the Philmont fee. The fee charged by the Iroquois Trail Council does not include spending money, Scout uniforms, or personal equipment.

COMPLETED APPLICATION & DEPOSIT OF \$200 DUE BY APRIL 1, 2010 applications will be received on a first come-first served basis at the Council Service Center. A \$100 registration fee must accompany all applications. This fee is NON-REFUNDABLE, but is transferable to a replacement Scout, should another Scout on the stand-by list be available.
