From The Scout Executive:

The children of today are often faced with choices that affect their development and safety. As Scouting leaders, we can do our best to provide education and guidance to prepare all of our Scouts to make the best decisions. One way we do this is to talk with our Scouts. Some subjects are easy to discuss with them – sports, their grades in school, their friends, and many other aspects of their daily lives. Other things are more difficult for us to discuss, such as child abuse – and especially child sexual abuse.

More than three million reports of child abuse are made each year, including a half million reports of child sexual abuse. As a major youth-serving organization, the Boy Scouts of America has a unique opportunity to help protect the youth of our nation.

This past month was promoted as “Youth Protection Month”. During April, I learned of a number of units who were conducting programs to promote the

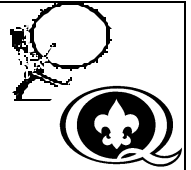

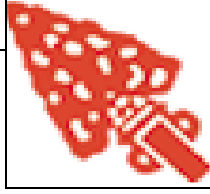


Genishaua District Spring Recruiting

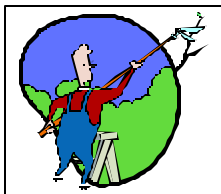

BSA's youth protection programs at the unit and den levels and with the parents as well. Several of the council's district roundtables included Youth Protection training as part of their monthly program. Just because we have started a new month, does not mean that it is to late to make Youth Protection an emphasis in your unit.

In an effort to protect our Scouts, each unit is encouraged to make the opportunity for training available as needed, but at least annually. Units can participate in one or more of the following ways:

- Ensure that the unit's adult leaders have taken Youth Protection training.
- Discuss with youth in a unit meeting the exercises found in "How to Protect Your Children from Child Abuse", the pull-out pamphlet in the front of each youth and adult handbook.
- Present the age-appropriate, award-winning video-based training with the meeting guide to your unit's youth and their parents.
 - o Youth Protection Training for Adult Volunteers and Parents
 - o "A Time to Tell" – for Cub Scouts
 - o "It Happened to Me" – for Boy Scouts
 - o "Youth Protection: Personal Safety Awareness – Venturing/Exploring.

In an effort to make "Youth Protection Guidelines for Adult Leaders and Parents" available and convenient for as many of our Scouters and parents as possible, this training is now available on the Iroquois Trail Council website. Simply log onto www.itcbsa.org and begin the training, which concludes with a test. Upon completion of the training, the participant will provide their name, address, email address, and council information. Once submitted, the name and information will be matched with the council's database of registered leaders. If the name is matched the participant will receive a certificate of completion, a letter from the Scout Executive, and the council youth protection reporting procedures. If the name is not matched, the participant will receive everything but the certificate of completion.

On-line training is one more way for units to help meet the requirement of a youth protection trained leader on all trips and outings now required on all tour permits.

Prepare your Scouts and their families: it may be the most important contribution you make in the lives of your Scouts.
