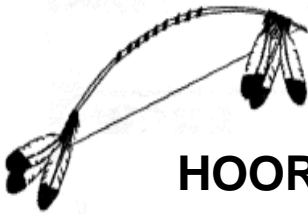
The Cub and parent weekend will be August 27-29, at Camp Sam Wood.
