WORDS FROM OUR LODGE CHIEF



Unit elections are coming to an end and soon enough we'll be at the Ordeal weekend. How many lodge brothers do we have in our lodge? Roughly 250, and about half are youth. How many lodge brothers (youth) were at the last LEC, not including the LEC members? Four. Including the LEC members. there were nine. It is not funny or amusing that we only had four youth members present that were not LEC officers.

How many Arrowmen in our lodge claim to be Troop OA Representatives? To be quite frank, I don't know. Why don't I know this? Well, I rarely receive any e-mails or communication from OA Troop Representatives, and very few Troop Rep's attend the monthly LEC's. Being a Troop OA Rep is a lot MORE than just wearing a patch on your uniform.

If you are a Troop OA Representative you are expected to attend the monthly Lodge Executive Committee meetings. It is a responsibility that goes with the job. By attending, you receive the information about Ordeal Weekends, upcoming events, as well as any other lodge business - such as unit elections. Then, it is the Troop OA Representative's responsibility to take this information back to their unit. How are you going to be able to get the information back to your unit if you don't attend the meetings? We will be reorganizing future LEC meetings and devote a portion of these meetings to provide handson Lodge Leadership training for adults and youth.

Arrowmen should realize that your LEC officers are only seven individuals. We're greatly behind in unit elections. We have more than 60 units that haven't been contacted or their Troop Rep's haven't contacted the LEC for an election. NJ Solis has been supervising elections for the Towpath District. I have been supervising elections in Nundawaga and Seneca Districts. In past issues of the Tehtas we have had a "Help Wanted" page. We have requested volunteers for ceremonies teams as well as for unit elections. No one, not one person, has responded or shown any interest.

A: Great question! The answer is "yes". The 25th and 40th OA Anniversary patches are the <u>only</u> patches authorized to be worn on the OA sash. According to National Policy, other patches, nametags, pins, and "the Legend" are not authorized for display on the OA sash.

Words from our Lodge Chief—continued

Our Lodge is behind on unit elections. One reason that we're behind on unit elections is a direct result of the lack of help being given to the elections committee by Lodge members. If Scouts are helpful, then why isn't the LEC receiving the help needed, even after advertising it clearly? We've sent out e-mails asking for help. Our next step will be to contact lodge members directly via phone calls. What will your excuse be?

Step up and get involved with the lodge! Who will run the lodge when the current officers age out?

Scheduling unit elections can be a lot of work when we wait to the last minute. In the fall of 2009, elections will begin in October and they will end by March. By reorganizing this we hope that we will be able to encourage more members to participate and increase our membership.

Your Lodge also needs help with ceremonies. Would you rather see a ceremony where parts are memorized and choreographed, or would you rather continue seeing last minute helpers reading from a script in the dark? Your Lodge needs youth and adults on every committee. The Lodge is not getting the required assistance from youth members. Therefore, our lodge is on a path which could lead to failure.

One of the Lodge's primary missions is camp promotions, which will be combined with Unit Elections. The youth in units should be the ones deciding where their units go to summer camp. If the Lodge is not actively promoting our Council camps then the youth in our units are not able to make an informed choice. What are we saying about our camps if we aren't promoting them?

Mailing List and Dues Payment



Responsibilities of the Troop OA Representative

Troop Representatives should not be receiving credit for serving in a leadership position for wearing the OA Troop Representative patch on their shoulder if they are not attending Lodge Executive Committee meetings. "Credit" means if scouts are using the Troop Representative position to qualify for rank advancement.

How many troops have provided the LEC with information on their troop representative?

Here are the OA Troop Representative Duties, for your reference:

- Serves as a communication link between the lodge and the troop
- Encourages year-round and resident camping in the troop
- Encourages older Scout participation in high adventure programs
- Encourages Scouts to actively participate in community service projects
- · Assists with leadership skills training in the troop
- Encourages Arrowmen to assume leadership positions in the troop
- Encourages Arrowmen in the troop to be active participants in lodge activities and to seal their membership in the Order by becoming Brotherhood members
- Sets a good example
- · Enthusiastically wears the Scout uniform correctly
- Lives by the Scout Oath, Scout Law, and Obligation of the Order
- Shows Scout Spirit
- Attends Lodge Executive Committee meetings
