
Letter from the Chief








Ceremonies is a crucial part of any lodge. The ceremony team is the group of people who put on regalia (native American style clothing) and perform various induction ceremonies at the spring and fall fellowship weekend, and it is at these weekends in which the newly elected candidates go through there ordeal. There is usually at least two teams of ceremonialist that makes up the whole group. There is the brotherhood team and the ordeal team. Our lodge has one of each team. There are two ceremonies which the ordeal team performs they are the pre-ordeal and the ordeal ceremonies. The pre ordeal is when we issue the challenges in which they must pass in order to be inducted into the Order of the Arrow. The ordeal ceremony is the actual induction and is when we explain the trials in which they have completed. Then after they have waited one year they then go through the brotherhood ceremony in which they seal their membership in the Order of the Arrow. Our teams work hard year round to perform great ceremonies for the newly inducted. But we are lacking in understudies and we need more people to join. We meet on the last Sunday of every month at the First Presbyterian Church in Batavia from 1 to 4.
