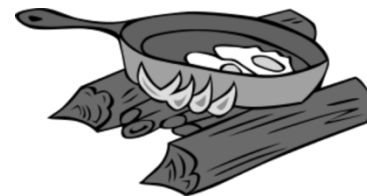

General Information

Event Dates- The Klondike runs from Friday, January 12th, to Sunday January 14th. Troops that are experienced in Cold Weather Camping are encouraged to stay the entire weekend, just one night or Units less familiar with winter camping may attend Saturday only for the events if they wish.

Registration- Units may arrive at the Medina Conservation Club no earlier than 4:00pm on Friday. Registration reopens Saturday at 7:00am. The event is on a point based system. Additional points will be awarded for Friday registration, staying the whole weekend, make a flag etc. (**AKA BONUS POINTS**).

Saturday Meals- Units are **responsible for their own breakfast and dinner**. Coffee and hot chocolate will be available in limited quantity. **For Lunch we are planning on doing a Dutch oven pot luck style lunch. So plan a signature dish that everyone can enjoy. Bring your dish to pass to the main building by 12:30.** Scouts will be given a chance to vote on their favorite dish.

Bathroom Facilities- Bathroom facilities with running water are provided.

Webelos and Arrow of Light Scouts- Webelos and AOL Scouts are welcome to participate all day Saturday. Webelos and AOL Scouts pay only **\$8** to for the Klondike.

What to Bring- Units should be prepared to cook in their sites with the appropriate gear, stoves, utensils, and mess kits. Units that wish to have a fire should bring a portable fire pit to ensure easy clean up on Sunday. Above all else, **bring plenty of water, layers of clothing, boots, and a change of clothes**.
